Participating in DD Council Meetings

They want to ensure that the funds being spent benefit those in need, and that the agencies that the DD Council supports have the tools needed to assist individuals with developmental disabilities and their families. Joey and Michelle shared that the need is greater than the amount of available funds, so Council has to be mindful of this to ensure funds are spent wisely.



August is national ABLE to Save Month, an opportunity to encourage financial wellness for our citizens living with disabilities and their families. State Treasurer Curtis Loftis administers the <u>Palmetto ABLE Savings</u> <u>Program</u>, a 529-A savings tool.

This tax-advantaged 529-A program allows eligible individuals to save without losing eligibility for important needs-based benefits. Contributions are tax deductible on a South Carolina income tax return, and participants can use their funds for a variety of <u>qualified expenses</u> such as basic living costs, assistive technology, health and wellness, employment training, housing, and transportation.



Partners in Policymaking[®] outlines the foundation for making systemic change by utilizing a shared vision through education, training, and a unified voice. The positive peer interaction strengthens individuals as well as collaborations and partnerships.
